Provincial Reports

Saskatchewan: (Charlene Talbot)

The Saskatchewan Chapter for the past few months has been focusing on funding and plan to send 2 members to COS in Montreal this June. Several of our members are busy preparing our

Biometry outcomes, demonstrating our compliance with the International Cataract Surgery benchmark published.

Ontario: Ottawa Chapter: (Rosemary Bickerton)

Our membership for Ontario is steady and we now at 57 members for 2013. Ophthalmology in Ontario is being highly scrutinized by the Ontario government as we are being asked to bring our cost per case down to \$497 for cataracts. Hospital centres for cataracts have had to become more efficient to meet this target. Centres are meeting the target by increasing their daily cataract volumes, standardizing equipment and processes, providing dedicated staff and dedicated space and by changing the staff mix ratio of RN:RPN. Charges to patients for specialty lenses and the IOL Master vary from centre to centre to cover the non insured services. Ontario is also seeing a variety of allied health professionals cover the area that was once covered by anesthesiologists. Conscious sedation is now performed by specially trained respiratory therapists and nurses. In some centres the patient is given a sedative such as Ativan PO.

Nurses are adapting to the changes by standardizing their processes and care. We are relooking at things we have done historically to see if there is a better and faster way. Caring for our patients is still our number one priority. It becomes even more important that our patients are well prepared pre operatively and go home with all the instructions needed for a good surgical outcome.

Ontario: GTA (Greater Toronto Area) Chapter: (Marlene Griffin)

The first meeting of the GTA Chapter of CSORN was held at the Branson division of North York General Hospital on April 3/13. This is the first time the group have met, and more than 20 nurses from 7 different institutes were represented there. A start up group, lead by Donna Punch will work on the formalization of the Chapter. We are planning a November dinner meeting with an educational speaker to formalize the formation of the Chapter. The main choice till now has been the Alcon IQ blue blocker lens.

When we have our next meeting I will discuss decreasing our meetings to twice a year from the 3 – 4 meetings per year.
